Over the next 4 years I would strive to achieve improvements to the local roads and buses. I would get potholes fixed, key junctions improved and critical factors such as bus lanes reviewed as they seem to impede traffic flow at the busiest times.

BETTER TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

The local roads around North Guildford are particularly slow-moving during peak travel times.

It is very hard to travel along Grange Road towards Stoughton Rd at certain times; especially during school drop off and pick up times. It is also difficult to travel along Stoughton Road over the rail bridge at the same time of day, as traffic is often backed back from Grange Rd. Parked vehicles and traffic-light phasing on both roads contribute to these difficulties it seems.

Grange Road can also be difficult to travel on because of the size of the speed bumps.

These are all issues that I wish to address so that improvements to the infrastructure of North Guildford.

Although residents have praised the improvement in pothole repairs and there has been resurfacing done on some of our major roads. A lot of work still needs to be done to bring them up to scratch.
