BARRY WANTS ACTION ON BELLFIELDS CAR ACCIDENT HOTSPOT

The Bellfields Roundabout has seen a spate of accidents and Barry wants to see the County Council take action

Barry Keane is calling on Surrey County Council to take action in Stoke following a series of accidents centred around the Bellfields Roundabout linking the A320 with Stoughton Road.

There have also been reports of stationery cars parked outside houses in the area being hit as people speed unnecessarily through the residential area.

Barry said: "Given the close proximity to Weyfield Academy and the fact that cars speed on the A320 and we do not have a 20 mph zone on Woking Rd, I really worry about the safety of residents.

"I have had two cars written off by speeding motorists while parked outside my house on Old Farm Road and I know I'm not alone in this. We need my 20mph zones around our community."

SLYFIELD REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

As Chairman of the SARP Forum, Barry Keane is there to make sure any development benefits us all

The Slyfield Area Regeneration Project (SARP) will mean relocation of the existing Guildford sewage treatment works owned by Thames Water, the relocation of the Guildford Borough Council depot and the relocation and enlargement of the Surrey County Council waste facilities.

This will create space for around 1,000 new homes on a brownfield site. The project will deliver a new, modern sewage treatment works reducing the smell and flies that affect local residents.

Barry said: "I am pleased that Guildford Borough Council has successfully applied for Housing Zone designation of the SARP housing site. This means that we now have access to £90million of funding to help sort the infrastructure issues in Stoke and if elected, I intend to fight for our fair share."
