Re-elected Guildford MP has spoken of her delight at achieving a record post-war majority in Guildford constituency on May 7.

Winning with more than 30,000 votes for the first time since David Howell in 1992, Anne — whose majority in 2005 was 347 — said that she was overwhelmed by both the result and the reception she got from voters during the campaign.

"I was delighted and thrilled," she said. "I could never have imagined that people would give me such a strong mandate.

"This seat has been a very marginal one in the past and people in Cranleigh and the villages are not easily won over. I'm humbled by the support I have received during the campaign and at the ballot box.
