#### **ALEX WORKS FOR BETTER PARKING IN HOLY TRINITY**

Alex Chesterfield has been working as part of a small group looking at how to improve on-street parking in Guildford town centre to provide better overall parking facilities for residents.

Recommendations were focussed on amending the current permit parking scheme to provide residents with a more reasonable chance of being able to park nearer to their homes.

The recommendations will be considered by Surrey County Council, then opened up to public consultation. Alex will continue to work hard to ensure the changes are in line with residents' needs and welcomes your views on the topic.

She said: "We all enjoy the convenience that being near Guildford town centre bring but one of the drawbacks is parking in our residential roads. Hopefully the work of our group will help address that."

As a result, Guildford Borough Council and town-centre Councillors have been working with a group of local residents to radically improve Westnye Gardens, opposite Debenhams.

Gerry Lytle said: "If we are to keep our town centre a vibrant and welcoming space in the future, we need to ensure that there are suitable facilities for families to enjoy as well as shopping and entertainment.

"I think what is being worked on is a

very important recognition that the town centre is really for everyone."

Alex Chesterfield said: "I'm thrilled to be working on an amazing project to turn Westnye Gardens into a fantastic new nature-based park.

"Despite the transformation, we are looking to make sure that it maintains the special character of the Garden, while being fun for children.

"Both residents and visitors will really benefit from the play area in the middle of the town. As a mum of two, I cannot wait until the park opens later this year and hope that many residents will feel the same way."

#### HIGHWAYS TO RECEIVE £20M POTHOLE REPAIR

Surrey County Council has applied for and received extra funding to help in the fight against pothholes.

Surrey has some of the busiest roads in the South of England and not only sees millions of commuter movements each years but is also the subject of development and on the route to our south coast ports.

As a result, heavy vehicles are particularly present and this increases wear and tear.

In recognition of this, the County Council has applied for £20million this year and £20million next year in order to prevent the situation of past winters where repair teams have not been able to keep up with pothole reports.

The extra money will allow more teams to be available for fixing potholes as they are reported by members of the public. Last winter, the number of reported potholes almost doubled.

**Clir Mark Brett-Warburton,** County Councillor for Holy Trinity, said: "This is good news as it will allow us to be more responsive. We will be fighting to ensure we get our fair share."
