INTEGRATING HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

Nils Christiansen is committed to integrating health and social care services.

Nils explained: "Over 20% of Guildford households include at least one person with a long term illness, and we all know friends and family suffering with chronic conditions.

The problem for these vulnerable people is that

they need both clinical and social help, and social care is administered by the council independently of the NHS.

The clinicians running the newly localised NHS need to work with County Councillors who understand these complex issues."



FIXING GUILDFORD'S INFRASTRUCTURE

There are numerous issues with the local roads which your current Liberal Democrat Councillor has failed to address.

Nils said: "In particular local residents have raised the following issues with me: peak hours congestion throughout the ward; excessive speed limits on key roads like Farnham Road and Wodeland

Avenue; insufficient residents parking; inconsiderate parking near shops and take-aways on Woodbridge Road and in Onslow; and some of the worst pot-holes in Surrey.

We need some near-term action on this, and a long-term strategic plan for improving our town centre."
